- Colleges and universities add a GPA boost to college course grades on admissions applications. This means that the grade you receive in your Dual Enrolled or Concurrent Enrolled course will be inflated like an AP or Honors course when you are applying to colleges!

Dual vs. Concurrent Enrollment

<p>Dual Enrollment lets you earn college credit for college courses taught at your high school campus – and those courses also count toward your high school diploma.</p>	<p>Concurrent Enrollment is when high school students are enrolled in college courses either online or at the college campus. This lets students jumpstart on developing a college transcript. These classes <i>can</i> count towards high school graduation requirements with prior approval from administration.</p>
<p>Student registration steps for Dual Enrollment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Apply to COS through CCC apply 2. Complete the online COS Registration form-link <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● You will be asked to provide contact information for your parent and your high school official (which is Mrs. Hilton). Have their names and correct email addresses ready before you complete the form. 3. Complete the Dual Enrollment Student & Parent Agreement form -link <p><i>Just some reminders</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Please note that all fields must be completed to be processed. This includes residency information, signature from a parent or guardian and a school official. Incomplete registrations will be returned to the student and not processed. ● Registrations are process by the date of the signatures – please make sure you register within the course registration timeline. 	<p>Student registration steps for Concurrent Enrollment:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Apply to COS through CCC apply 2. Complete the online COS Registration form-link <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● You will be asked to provide contact information for your parent and your high school official (which is Mrs. Hilton). Have their names and correct email addresses ready before you complete the form. <p>The main difference between Advanced Placement and College Courses are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Advanced Placement -students need to take a test at the end of the course and must score a 3, 4, or 5 to get college credit. ● College Courses – Students receive credit for the class if they receive an A, B, or C. <p>Per Board Policy 6172.1 and information outlined in our Student Handbook, college credits earned while enrolled at Etna High School may be used to meet elective credits with prior approval. Etna High School will grant 3.33 credits for every college credit earned.</p>
